Crochet Teal Gingham Blanket

MATERIALS

Baby Bee Sweet Delight (60% acrylic & 40% polyamide, 4 oz/377 yds)

2 skeins Surf Baby (medium shade), 1 skein Teal Too (dark shade), 1 skein Angel (white)

Size H/5.00mm hook, scissors, tapestry needle

SIZE

Finished size 32 in x 28 in

STITCHES

Single Crochet (SC): Insert your hook, yarn over (YO) and pull up a loop, YO, pull through two loops.

Double Crochet (DC): YO, insert your hook, pull up a loop, YO, pull through two loops, YO, pull through remaining two loops.

PATTERN

Chain 122 with the medium shade. (Pattern repeat is 11 plus 1. This means you can make any size you'd like, just make sure it's a multiple of 11, then add 1.)

Row 1: SC in second chain from hook. *DC next stitch, SC in the next, repeat * for a total of 11 stitches. In the 11th stitch, which will be a SC, pull through just before finishing the stitch with dark shade of yarn. DC in next stitch bringing the medium shade along the work and crocheting over the yarn. *SC next stitch, DC in the next, repeat * for the next 11 stitches. Pull up the medium shade and change colors just before you finish the DC. Continue alternating the color changes every 11 stitches and continue working the pattern of alternating DC and SC. Your last stitch should be a SC. CH 1 and turn.

Row 2: Bring the dark shade around the end of your work and continue crocheting over this strand. Work your first SC into the SC you just made of the row below. Then, work a DC into the next DC. Continue this alternating pattern and before you finish the 11th stitch, pull up the lighter shade to change colors. Now work the next 11 stitches with the new color, switching back to the darker shade in the 11th stitch. Finish alternating colors to the end of the row, chain one and turn.

Rows 3 – 10: Continue switching colors every 11th stitch. Pull through the last stitch with the white color.

Row 11: Cut off the dark shade, leaving a long end to weave in later, about nine inches. Work your alternating SC and DC into the next 11 spaces with white and crocheting over the medium shade. At the 11th stitch, pull through with the medium shade. Now work the pattern across alternating white and medium shade. Continue for 9 more rows.

Repeat this pattern for the rest of the blanket.

Tip: You will use the medium shade throughout the entire blanket. You will only cut off the white or the darker shade.

BORDER

Weave in all the ends when you finish your blanket. Pull up a loop in any corner and work one SC. SC around the entire blanket, working 3 SC into each corner space and work one SC per stitch on the sides of the blanket. Finish the round by working the remaining 2 SC into the corner space, slip stitch to the starting SC, chain 2 and turn.

DC into the top of each SC around, working 1 DC, CH2, 1 DC into the center SC of each corner. Finish with 1 DC into the starting SC, Ch 2 and slip stitch into the top of the turning chain. CH 1 and turn. SC into the top of each DC and work 3 SC around each chain 2 spaces in the corners. Join with first SC and tie off. Weave in remaining ends with tapestry needle.
