Crochet Boho Berry Stitch Blanket

MATERIALS

Caron Simply Soft (100% acrylic, 170 g/6 oz, 288 m/315 yds)

3 skeins White, 1 skein each Soft Green, Plum Wine, Light Country Peach

Size H/5.00mm hook, tapestry needle, scissors

SIZE

Finished size 28 in x 36 in

STITCHES

Single Crochet (SC): Insert your hook, yarn over (YO) and pull up a loop, YO and pull through two loops on hook.

Berry Stitch: YO, insert your hook, YO and pull up a loop, YO and pull through first loop on hook. YO, insert your hook into same space, YO and pull up a loop, YO and pull through all loops on hook.

PATTERN

Chain 96 in white. (If you'd like to make the blanket bigger, chain any multiple of 6.)

SC (single crochet) in each chain across. Chain 1 and turn. SC in each SC across. Chain 1 and turn. Repeat for three more rows. (So work 5 rows of SC).

First Set of Stripes

On the last white row, pull through with plum before you complete the last SC (you should have two loops on your hook when you pull the plum through). Chain one and turn.

Work 5 SC, then a berry stitch. Continue working SC, placing a berry stitch every sixth stitch. So work 5 SC, Berry, 5 SC, Berry, etc. You should end with 5 SC.

On the last stitch of the plum row, pull through with white, then chain one and turn. SC 5 rows of white, chaining one and turning at the end of each row. On the last stitch of the fifth row, pull through with light country peach and chain one and turn.

Work 2 SC, then a berry stitch so that the berries are alternating with the plum row. Then place a berry stitch every sixth stitch. So after the first berry, work 5 SC, Berry, 5 SC, Berry, etc. You should end with 2 SC.

On the last stitch of the peach row, pull through with white, chain one and turn. SC 5 rows of white, chaining one and turning at the end of each row. On the last stitch of the fifth row, pull through with soft green and chain one and turn.

Work 5 SC, then a berry stitch. Continue working SC, placing a berry stitch every sixth stitch. So work 5 SC, Berry, 5 SC, Berry, etc. You should end with 5 SC. On the last SC of the green row, pull through with white. Chain one and turn.

SC 11 rows of white, chaining one and turning at the end of each row.

Second Set of Stripes

On the last stitch of white, pull through with plum. Chain one and turn.

Work 2 SC, then a berry stitch. Continue working SC, placing a berry stitch every sixth stitch. So work 5 SC, Berry, 5 SC, Berry, etc. You should end with 2 SC.

On the last stitch of the plum row, pull through with white. Chain one and turn. SC 5 rows of white, chaining one and turning at the end of each row. On the last stitch of the fifth row, pull through with light country peach. Chain one and turn.

Work 5 SC, then a berry stitch. Continue working SC, placing a berry stitch every sixth stitch. So work 5 SC, Berry, 5 SC, Berry, etc. You should end with 5 SC.

On the last stitch of the peach row, pull through with white. Chain one and turn. SC 5 rows of white, chaining one and turning at the end of each row. On the last stitch of the fifth row, pull through with soft green. Chain one and turn.

Work 2 SC, then a berry stitch. Continue working SC, placing a berry stitch every sixth stitch. So work 5 SC, Berry, 5 SC, Berry, etc. You should end with 2 SC.

On the last stitch of the green row, pull through with white. Chain one and turn. Work 11 rows of white with SC, then repeat starting with the first set of stripes!

I ended up with six sets of stripes when I felt the blanket was the length I wanted (small stroller blanket size).

After tying off and weaving in my ends I added some simple tassels by cutting even pieces of yarn and tying them to the ends of the blanket.
