Crochet Boho Color Block Blanket

MATERIALS

Caron Simply Soft (100% acrylic, 170 g/6 oz, 288 m/315 yds)

1 skein each White, Soft Green, Light Country Peach, Victorian Rose

Size H/5.00mm hook, tapestry needle, scissors

SIZE

Finished size 30 in x 40 in

STITCHES

Single Crochet (SC): Insert your hook, yarn over (YO) and pull up a loop, YO and pull through two loops on hook.

Modified Daisy (explained in pattern below)

PATTERN

Chain any odd number. (To make a baby blanket that is appx. 30 in x 40 in., chain an odd number between 120 and 130.)

Row 1: Yarn over (YO) and pull up a loop in the second chain from the hook, YO and pull up a loop in the third chain from the hook. Skip over the next (fourth) chain, then YO and insert your hook into the next (fifth) chain and pull up a loop. YO and pull through all seven loops on your hook. CH 1.

*YO and insert your hook into the CH 1 space and pull up a loop. YO and insert your hook into the last chain space you worked into and pull up a loop. Skip over the next chain, then YO and insert your hook into the next chain and pull up a loop. YO and pull through all seven loops. CH 1. Repeat from * to the end of the row. CH 3 and turn. (The first of these chains is the one that closes the loops.)

Row 2: YO and work into the second chain from the hook and pull up a loop, insert your hook into the third chain from the hook and pull up a loop, skip the next stitch, YO and pull up a loop in the next space. YO and pull through all seven loops. CH 1.

*YO and insert your hook into the chain space and pull up a loop, YO and insert your hook into the next space and pull up a loop, skip over one stitch, YO and insert your hook into the next space and pull up a loop. YO and pull through all loops on your hook. Repeat from * to the end of the row, CH 3 and turn.

Repeat row 2 for the rest of the blanket. When changing colors, you'll want to pull through with the new color on the last stitch of the row when you have seven loops on your hook. Then you'll chain 3 with the new color and turn.

Here is the color pattern I used: 10 rows Victorian Rose, 10 rows Light Country Peach, 10 rows Soft Green, 10 rows White, 10 rows Soft Green, 10 rows Light Country Peach, 10 rows Victorian Rose

BORDER

When I finished the blanket, I decided to add a simple thin white border before adding the tassels. To add the border, pull up a loop in any corner and chain one, then work a SC plus CH 1 in every other stitch (or between the posts on the sides) around the whole blanket, working 3 SCs into the corners. When you reach the corner you started with, work 1 round of SC in every other stitch, again working 3 SCs into the corners. When you get back to where you started, slip stitch into the corner and tie off.

Before I added the tassels, I blocked the blanket by laying it out flat, getting it wet with a spray bottle and pinning the corners to help get the sides straight.

TASSELS

First, take some yarn and wrap it around a notebook or anything square. I used a book that was about 8 inches in length. After you wrap the yarn, use some scissors to cut it in half so that all the strands are equal. So for this blanket my strands were all about 16 in. long.

Then, take 3 pieces of yarn and line them up evenly and fold them in half. Then use your fingers or a crochet hook to insert the loop you just made into a chain space on the end of your blanket. When you pull it through, you want the loop to be facing away from the blanket, not towards it.

Pull the straight ends of the yarn through the loop and pull it tight to make a knot. I trimmed the ends so they were all about the same length.
