

# Daisy Farm Crafts

## Crochet Blue and Gray V-Stitch Blanket

### MATERIALS

Caron Simply Soft (100% acrylic, 170 g/6 oz, 288 m/315 yds)

2 skeins White, 1 skein Light Country Blue, 1 skein Gray Heather

Size H/5.00mm hook, tapestry needle, scissors

### SIZE

Finished size 34 in x 38 in

### STITCHES

**Single Crochet (SC):** Insert your hook, yarn over (YO) and pull up a loop, YO and pull through two loops on hook.

**Double Crochet (DC):** YO, insert your hook, YO and pull up a loop, YO and pull through two loops, YO and pull through remaining two loops.

## **PATTERN**

**Chain 100** in White (or any even number).

**Row 1:** In the fourth chain from the hook work 2 DC. Skip the next chain space, \*DC 2 in the next chain space, then skip the next chain.\* Repeat \* across the row and work one DC into the very last chain. Chain 3 and turn. (This will count as your first DC) on the next row.

**Row 2:** Work 2 DC in between each pair of DC from the row below. Insert your hook into the space between them. Repeat across the whole row and end with one DC into the top of the first chain three. Chain 3 and turn.

**Continue repeating row 2** until blanket measures appx. 38 inches or your desired length. I ended up with 85 rows total when the blanket was the length I wanted.

**Here is the color pattern that I used:** 5 rows White, 1 row Blue, 2 rows White, 2 rows Gray, 1 row White, 2 rows Gray, 2 rows White, 1 row Blue. Repeat from beginning.

When changing colors, you'll want to pull through with the new color on the last DC of the row, when you have two loops left on your hook. Then you'll cut the yarn you're not using anymore, leaving a tail that is long enough to weave in later. (On some of the rows, you can leave the yarn and just carry it up the side if you end up back on the side where you left off. Then you'll just cover up that yarn with your border.)

## **BORDER**

Tie off and weave in all ends before starting the border. For this blanket I decided to just keep it simple and work two rows of single crochet around the edge.

Pull up a loop with gray in any corner. Work one SC in that space. Work SC around the entire blanket keeping your stitches to about 2 per each block of color on the sides. Check your work often to prevent rippling and adding too many stitches. Work 3 SC into each corner space. When you return to the starting corner, work remaining two SC and slip stitch to join and tie off.
