Crochet Lines and Dashes Blanket

MATERIALS

Bernat Baby Blanket Tiny (100% polyester, 100 g/3.5 oz., 288 m/316 yds) 4 skeins Dungarees, 1 skein Snow Cap Size G/4.00mm hook, tapestry needle, scissors

SIZE

Finished size 32 in x 42 in Gauge 4 in = 15 st and 12 rows of WHDC

STITCHES

Half Double Crochet (HDC): Yarn over (YO), insert your hook, YO and pull up a loop, YO and pull through three loops.

Wide Half Double Crochet (WHDC): YO, insert your hook between stitch posts, YO and pull up a loop, YO and pull through three loops.

PATTERN

Chain 163 with white. (I wanted my stripes and dashes to run lengthwise when I was finished, so I made a really long base chain, if you'd like to make your blanket bigger or smaller, multiply 7 by any odd number and then add 2.)

Row 1: Starting in the 3rd chain from the hook, work 1 HDC in each chain. When you reach the last chain, pull through with blue before you finish the last stitch (you should have 3 loops on your hook when you pull through.) Chain 2 and turn with blue, and cut the white, leaving a 4 to 6 inch tail.

Note: To save time weaving in ends, you can wrap the tail around the back of your work on the next row and crochet over it. (Normally we like to weave in ends after we finish a blanket to make sure they stay secure, but since this yarn is more 'sticky' we feel good about just crocheting over them.)

Rows 2 - 4: With blue, work 1 WHDC in each space across the row. (From now on you will always be inserting your hook in between the stitch posts of the previous row. Be sure not to miss the last stitch between the last post and the turning chain.) Chain 2 and turn at the end of each row. On the last stitch of row 4, pull through with white. Chain 2 and turn.

Row 5: With white, work 1 WHDC in each space across the row. On the last stitch of the row, pull through with blue. Chain 2 and turn.

Rows 6 - 8: With blue, work 1 WHDC in each space across the row. On the last stitch of row 8, pull through with white. Chain 2 and turn.

Row 9: With white, work 1 WHDC in each space across the row. On the last stitch of the row, pull through with blue. Chain 2 and turn.

Rows 10 - 12: With blue, work 1 WHDC in each space across the row. On the last stitch of row 12, pull through with white. Chain 2 and turn. Do NOT cut the blue yarn.

Row 13: *Work 1 WHDC in each of the first 7 spaces with white, crocheting over the blue as you carry it along the top of your work. On the 7th stitch, pull through with blue. Then work 7 WHDCs in blue, carrying the white along as you crochet. On the 7th stitch, pull through with white. Repeat from * to the end of the row. On the last stitch, pull through with blue.

Rows 14 - 16: With blue, work 1 WHDC in each space across the row. On the last stitch of row 16, pull through with white. Chain 2 and turn. Do NOT cut the blue yarn.

Note: When you are inserting your hook in between the posts on the rows right after the dash rows, be sure to insert your hook underneath the yarn that you carried through on the dash row.

Row 17: *Work 7 WHDCs with white, crocheting over the blue as you carry along the back of your work. On the 7th stitch, pull through with blue. Then work 7 WHDCs in blue, carrying the white along as you crochet. On the 7th stitch, pull through with white. Repeat from * to the end of the row. On the last stitch, pull through with blue.

Rows 18 - 20: With blue, work 1 WHDC in each space across the row. On the last stitch of row 20, pull through with white. Chain 2 and turn. Do NOT cut the blue yarn.

Row 21: *Work 7 WHDCs with white, crocheting over the blue as you carry along the back of your work. On the 7th stitch, pull through with blue. Then work 7 WHDCs in blue, carrying the white along as you crochet. On the 7th stitch, pull through with white. Repeat from * to the end of the row. On the last stitch, pull through with blue.

Rows 22 - 24: With blue, work 1 WHDC in each space across the row. On the last stitch of row 24, pull through with white. Chain 2 and turn.

Row 25: With white, work 1 WHDC in each space across the row. On the last stitch of the row, pull through with blue. Chain 2 and turn.

Rows 26 - 28: With blue, work 1 WHDC in each space across the row. On the last stitch of row 28, pull through with white. Chain 2 and turn. Do NOT cut the blue yarn.

Row 29: With white, work 1 WHDC in each space across the row. On the last stitch of the row, pull through with blue. Chain 2 and turn.

Rows 30 - 32: With blue, work 1 WHDC in each space across the row. On the last stitch of row 32, pull through with white. Chain 2 and turn. Do NOT cut the blue yarn.

Row 33: With white, work 1 WHDC in each space across the row. On the last stitch of the row, pull through with blue. Chain 2 and turn.

Repeat rows 6 through 33 until you reach your desired length.

BORDER

When I finished my last white stripe at the end of the blanket, I worked one row of WHDC in blue and then kept going around the edge of the blanket, working HDC, CH 2, HDC into each of the corners. Since both sides of this stitch look the same, I just kept going around the blanket two more times. On the third time around, I worked 3 HDCs into each corner. When I reached the corner I started with, I slip stitched into the corner and tied off.
