Mandy's Crochet Heart Blanket

MATERIALS

Bernat Baby Blanket (100% polyester, 100 g/3.5 oz, 65 /72 yds)
4 skeins Seafoam, 1 skein Vanilla
Size M/10mm hook, tapestry needle, scissors
Sewing needle, thread

SIZE

Finished size 40 in x 60 in

STITCHES

Half Double Crochet (HDC): Yarn over (YO), insert your hook, YO and pull up a loop, YO and pull through three loops on hook.

Half Double Slip Stitch (HDSS): YO, insert your hook, YO, pull up a loop and directly through loops on hook.

Single Crochet (SC): Insert your hook, YO and pull up a loop, YO, pull through two loops.

PATTERN

Chain 102 with Seafoam. (Blanket is worked lengthwise, so if you'd like your blanket a bit longer, make a longer chain. There is no pattern repeat so any number is fine.)

ROW 1: Starting in the 3rd chain from the hook, work 1 HDC in each chain. CH 1 and turn.

ROW 2: Work 1 HDSS in the back loops only of each stitch across the row. CH 2 and turn. (The chain 2 will not count as a stitch now and throughout.)

ROW 3: Work 1 HDC in the back loops only of each stitch across the row. CH 1 and turn. Repeat rows 2 and 3 for a total of 56 rows. (Feel free to adjust this number to as wide of a blanket you like.)

Work a final row of HDC (Row 2) and tie off and weave in all ends.

BORDER

Pull up a loop in any corner with Vanilla. Work one SC into the corner and in each space down one side. Be careful to just work one SC per stitch. If you find your blanket is ruffling, your stitches are too close together. Take them out and space them further apart so the blanket lays flat. When you get to the first corner, work 3 SC into the corner space. Work one stitch into each space on the ends.

Continue around the blanket working 3 SC into the remaining corner spaces. When you return to the starting corner, work the final two SC and slip stitch and join to the first SC. Chain 1 and turn. Repeat working SC around the blanket for two more rounds in this manner. Tie off and weave in the ends when you are finished.

Time to make a heart!

HEART PATTERN

CH 2, 3 SC into the first chain. CH 1 and turn. 2 SC into the first ST, SC the next, 2 SC into the last ST. (5 SC)

CH 1 and turn. 2 SC into the first ST, SC in the next 3 stitches, 2 SC into the last ST. (7 SC)

CH 1 and turn. 2 SC into the first ST, SC in the next 5 stitches, 2 SC into the last ST. (9 SC)

CH 1 and turn. 2 SC into the first ST, SC in the next 7 stitches, 2 SC into the last ST. (11 SC)

CH 1 and turn. 2 SC into the first ST, SC in the next 9 stitches, 2 SC into the last ST. (13 SC)

(Stop increase) CH 1 and turn, SC in each ST across (13 SC) (Repeat this for 4 more rows).

CH 1 and turn. SC in the next 6 stitches. CH 1 and turn, Skip first stitch and SC into the next 5 stitches.

CH 1 and turn. Skip the first stitch and SC into the next 3 stitches, SLIP STitch into the last space. Tie off.

Weave in end. (Weave in the tail end too while you're at it.)

Now we will work the other side. Go back to the row you worked the 6 SC, skip a space and pull up a loop in the 8th stitch. SC in each remaining 5 SC to the end of the row.

CH 1 and turn, SC in the next 5 stitches, (there will be one left at the end, where you pulled up a loop.)

CH 1 and turn, SKIP first stitch, SC in each stitch across (4 SC).

CH 1 and continuing in the same direction, work a SC in each space around the entire heart, working 3 sc into the very bottom point. Slip Stitch into the beginning stitch, tie off and weave in all the ends.

With a regular needle, and a white thread. Attach heart to the blanket in the lower corner. I placed the heart so the stripes ran vertically behind it.
