Crochet Picnic Gingham Hot Pads

# **MATERIALS**

for two hot pads

Lily Sugar 'n Cream The Original Yarn (100% cotton, 71 g/2.5 oz, 109 m/120 yds) 1 skein Ecru, 1 skein Tea Rose, 1 skein Tangerine, 1 skein Beachglass, 1 skein Seabreeze Size H/5.00mm hook, tapestry needle, scissors

#### SIZE

Finished size 7 in x 7 in Gauge 4 in = 14 st and 10 rows of HDC

## **STITCHES**

Half Double Crochet (HDC): Yarn over (YO), insert your hook, YO and pull up a loop, YO and pull through all three loops on hook.

#### **PATTERN**

Changing colors: Pull through with the new color just before you finish the HDC stitch, when you still have 3 loops on your hook. Lay whichever color you aren't using across the top of your work and crochet over it until you are ready to use it again. To avoid your yarn getting twisted as you carry it along your work, it helps to always keep one color to the front and one color to the back each time you switch colors.

# ORANGE SHADES HOT PAD (Ecru, Tea Rose and Tangerine):

Chain (CH) 23 with Ecru.

**ROW 1:** With Ecru, HDC in the 3rd chain from the hook, then HDC in each of the next 2 chains. \*HDC in each of the next 3 chains with Tea Rose, then HDC in each of the next 3 chains with Ecru, always crocheting over whichever color you aren't using and carrying it along your work. Repeat from \* to the end of the row. CH 2 and turn (turning chain does not count as a stitch).

ROW 2: Wrap the Tea Rose around the side of your work and crochet over it as you \*HDC in each of the next 3 stitches with Ecru, then HDC in each of the next 3 stitches with Tea Rose, always crocheting over whichever color you aren't using and carrying it along your work. Repeat from \* to the end of the row. On the last stitch of the row, pull through with Tea Rose. CH 2 and turn. You can either cut the Ecru and leave a tail to weave in later, or leave the Ecru and pick it back up when you are ready to use it again.

**ROW 3:** \*HDC in each of the next 3 stitches with Tea Rose, then HDC in each of the next 3 stitches with Tangerine, always crocheting over whichever color you aren't using and carrying it along your work. Repeat from \* to the end of the row. CH 2 and turn.

**ROW 4:** Repeat row 3. On the last stitch of the row, pull through with Ecru then CH 2 and turn. You can either cut the Tangerine and leave a tail to weave in later, or leave the Tangerine and pick it back up when you are ready to use it again.

**ROW 5:** \*HDC in each of the next 3 stitches with Ecru, then HDC in each of the next 3 stitches with Tea Rose, always crocheting over whichever color you aren't using and carrying it along your work. Repeat from \* to the end of the row. CH 2 and turn.

**ROW** 6: \*HDC in each of the next 3 stitches with Ecru, then HDC in each of the next 3 stitches with Tea Rose, always crocheting over whichever color you aren't using and carrying it along your work. Repeat from \* to the end of the row. On the last stitch of the row, pull through with Tea Rose. CH 2 and turn.

Repeat rows 3 through 6 two more times.

When you finish the first square, tie off, weave in any ends and set it aside. Then make a second square, following the pattern from the beginning. When you have two squares, line them up evenly and place them together.

Pull up a loop in the top left corner with Ecru, inserting your hook through both squares, and chain 2. Now, HDC around the edges of the squares, inserting your hook through both squares to stitch them together. Work 3 HDCs into each corner.

When you reach the corner you started with, slip stitch into the corner, chain 10, then slip stitch back into the same corner to make a loop. Tie off, and leave a long tail that you can wrap around the base of the loop a few times, then weave the tail with a tapestry needle into the hot pad to keep it secure. Weave in any other ends.

# TEAL SHADES HOT PAD (Ecru, Beachglass and Seabreeze):

Chain (CH) 23 with Ecru.

**ROW 1:** With Ecru, HDC in the 3rd chain from the hook, then HDC in each of the next 2 chains. \*HDC in each of the next 3 chains with Beachglass, then HDC in each of the next 3 chains with Ecru, always crocheting over whichever color you aren't using and carrying it along your work. Repeat from \* to the end of the row. CH 2 and turn (turning chain does not count as a stitch).

ROW 2: Wrap the Beachglass around the side of your work and crochet over it as you \*HDC in each of the next 3 stitches with Ecru, then HDC in each of the next 3 stitches with Beachglass, always crocheting over whichever color you aren't using and carrying it along your work. Repeat from \* to the end of the row. On the last stitch of the row, pull through with Beachglass. CH 2 and turn. You can either cut the Ecru and leave a tail to weave in later, or leave the Ecru and pick it back up when you are ready to use it again.

**ROW 3:** \*HDC in each of the next 3 stitches with Beachglass, then HDC in each of the next 3 stitches with Seabreeze, always crocheting over whichever color you aren't using and carrying it along your work. Repeat from \* to the end of the row. CH 2 and turn.

**ROW 4:** Repeat row 3. On the last stitch of the row, pull through with Ecru then CH 2 and turn. You can either cut the Seabreeze and leave a tail to weave in later, or leave the Seabreeze and pick it back up when you are ready to use it again.

**ROW 5:** \*HDC in each of the next 3 stitches with Ecru, then HDC in each of the next 3 stitches with Beachglass, always crocheting over whichever color you aren't using and carrying it along your work. Repeat from \* to the end of the row. CH 2 and turn.

**ROW 6:** \*HDC in each of the next 3 stitches with Ecru, then HDC in each of the next 3 stitches with Beachglass, always crocheting over whichever color you aren't using and carrying it along your work. Repeat from \* to the end of the row. On the last stitch of the row, pull through with Beachglass. CH 2 and turn.

## Repeat rows 3 through 6 two more times.

When you finish the first square, tie off, weave in any ends and set it aside. Then make a second square, following the pattern from the beginning. When you have two squares, line them up evenly and place them together. (Follow instructions above to combine the squares).
