

Daisy Farm Crafts

Crochet Baby T Blanket

MATERIALS

Caron Simply Soft (170 g/6 oz, 288 m/315 yds)

4 skeins White, 1 skein each Persimmon, Light Country Peach, Light Country Blue, Country Blue
Size H/5.00mm hook, tapestry needle, scissors

SIZE

Finished size 34 in x 36 in

Gauge 4 in = 18 st and 18 rows of pattern

STITCHES

Single Crochet (SC): Insert your hook, yarn over (YO), pull up a loop, YO, pull through two loops on hook.

Slip Stitch (SL ST): Insert your hook, YO and pull directly through loop on hook.

PATTERN

With White, **chain 130** (to make your blanket larger, chain any even number.)

Row 1: Work 1 single crochet (SC) into the second chain from the hook. *CH 1, skip 1 chain, SC into the next chain. Repeat from * across to the end of the chain. The last stitch should be a SC. CH 1 and turn.

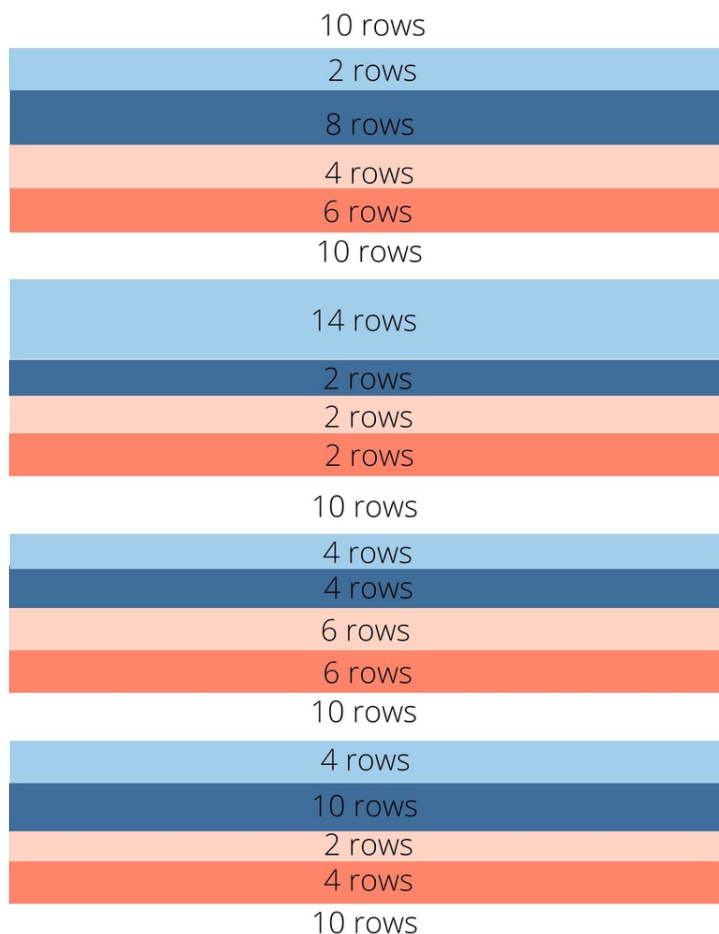
Row 2: Work 1 SC into the first SC. *CH 1, skip 1 chain, SC into the next SC. Repeat from * across the row. CH 1 and turn.

Rows 3 - 10: Repeat Row 2 with White.

Remaining Rows: Repeat row 2 instructions, refer to the graph below for color changes.

Tip: to change colors, work to the last step of the single crochet stitch, lay the new color over your hook, pull through to finish the stitch with the new color.

Tie off and weave in all the ends.



BORDER

With white, pull up a loop in any corner, ch 1. SC into that space. Work 1 SC into each stitch around as evenly as possible. Work 1 SC around the ch 1 spaces as well, work 3 SC into each corner. Join with a slip stitch to the starting SC.

CH 10 (or any number if you'd like your border wider or more narrow). Starting in the second chain from the hook, *work 1 SC. Work 1 SC into the back loop of each of the next 8 chains back toward the edge of the blanket. Slip stitch into the next stitch, and in the next stitch. Turn and work in the back loops of each of the 8 SC you just made, work 1 SC into the last stitch. CH 1 and turn. Repeat from * around the edge of the blanket.

Corners:

In the first of the three stitches that make the corner, only slip stitch once, before turning and working the SC back up to the edge. Return and slip stitch into the corner space. Turn and work the SC back up to the edge. When you return to the corner space, slip stitch again into the same corner space, then work the SC up to the edge. Upon returning, slip stitch one more time into the same corner space for a total of 3 times, before moving on and only slip stitching one time into the next space.

Tip: You may adjust the number of slip stitches in between rows if the edge is stretching or the blanket edge is rippling. You may prefer just doing 1 slip stitch instead of 2.

When all sides are complete, use a tapestry needle to sew the last side to the beginning chain 10. Tie off and weave in the ends.
