

# Daisy Farm Crafts

## Baby Jack's Crochet Wavy Lines Blanket

### MATERIALS

Sugar Bush Bold (100% extra fine merino wool, 100 g/3.5 oz, 174 m/190 yds)

5 skeins Mossy Teal, 1 skein Fresh Snow

Size J/6.00mm hook, tapestry needle, scissors

### SIZE

Finished size 28 in x 32 in

### STITCHES

**Single Crochet (SC):** Insert your hook, YO and pull up a loop, YO and pull through 2 loops on hook.

### PATTERN

**Chain 120** (or any even number) with Blue color.

**ROW 1:** Work 1 SC into the second chain from the hook. \*CH 1, skip 1 chain, SC into the next chain. Repeat from \* across to the end of the chain (mesh stitch). The last stitch should be a SC. CH 1 and turn.

**ROW 2:** Work 1 SC into the first SC. \*CH 1, skip 1 chain, SC into the next SC. Repeat from \* across the row. CH 1 and turn.

**ROWS 3 - 5:** Repeat row 2. At the end of the 5th row, pull through with White color on the last SC. Ch 1 with White and turn. Cut the Blue and leave a 6 to 9 inch tail you can weave into the blanket.

**ROW 6:** Repeat row 2 with White. At the end of the row, pull through with Blue on the last stitch. Ch 1 with Blue and turn. Cut the White and leave a tail you can weave into the blanket.

**ROWS 7 - 11:** Repeat row 2 with Blue.

**Repeat rows 6 through 11** until your blanket measures appx. 32 in (or your desired length). You should always work 5 rows of Blue between every row of White. When you finish, tie off and weave in all ends with a tapestry needle.

## **BORDER**

**Round 1:** Pull up a loop in any corner and chain one. Work the mesh stitch (SC, CH 1, skip 1) around the sides and ends of the blanket. In the corners, work SC, CH 1, SC all into the same space. (You can also work 3 SCs in the corners if you like the look of that better.)

**Round 2:** When you reach the starting corner, slip stitch into the corner, chain 1 and turn and continue working mesh stitch around the blanket.

**Repeat round 2** until you reach your desired border thickness. I did 6 rounds total of the mesh stitch around my blanket for the border. When you finish your border, slip stitch into the final corner and tie off.

If you'd like to add finishing touches to your blanket, lay it out flat on a towel or foam blocking boards if you have them. Use a spray bottle with water to dampen the blanket. Press the blanket into straight lines, massaging the stitches and adjusting your tension. Pin with straight pins and let it dry.
