CJ's Crochet Flower Blanket

MATERIALS

Patons Beehive Baby Sport (70% acrylic, 30% nylon, 100 g/3.5 oz, 328 m/359 yds) 5 skeins Angel White
Size G/4.0mm hook, scissors, tapestry needle

SIZE

Finished size 34 in x 34 in

STITCHES

Single Crochet (SC): Insert your hook into designated stitch, yarn over and pull a loop back through, yarn over and pull through 2 loops.

Double Crochet (DC): Yarn over and insert hook into designated stitch, yarn over and pull a loop back through, yarn over and pull through 2 loops, yarn over and pull through final 2 loops on hook.

Double Crochet 5 together (DC5TOG): Yarn over and insert hook, yarn over and pull a loop back through, yarn over and pull through 2 loops, yarn over and insert hook into next designated stitch (or eye in this pattern) yarn over and pull a loop back through, yarn over and pull through 2 loops, insert hook again into same eye, yarn over and pull a loop back through, yarn over and pull through 2 loops. Yarn over and insert hook into next designated eye, yarn over and pull a loop back through, yarn over and pull through 2 loops, yarn over and insert hook into same eye, yarn over and pull a loop back through, yarn over and pull through 2 loops. Yarn over and pull through 3 loops. Yarn over and pull through 4 loops. Yarn over and pull through 3 loops on hook to complete the stitch.

PATTERN

Chain 156 or any multiple of 3 to approximately 34 inches.

Row 1: Work 1 DC into the 3rd chain from the hook. Chain 3. Work the first leg of the DC5TOG into the base of the chain 3, (yarn over, insert your hook into the base of the chain 3, yarn over and pull a loop back through, yarn over and pull through 2 loops.)

Yarn over and insert your hook into the base of the DC and work the 2nd and 3rd legs of the DC5TOG, (*yarn over, insert your hook into the base of the DC, yarn over and pull a loop back through, yarn over and pull through two loops, repeat from *.)

Skip 2 chains, yarn over and insert your hook into the next chain and work the 4th and 5th legs of the DC5tog, (work legs as explained for 3rd and 4th.) After making the fifth leg, there should be 6 loops on your hook, yarn over and pull through all 6 loops.

*Chain 3. (The first chain is considered the eye of the flower or center.) Work the first leg of the DC5TOG in the eye, or first chain, work the 2nd and 3rd legs of the DC5TOG in the chain stitch where the last stitch was worked, skip 2 chains, work the 4th and 5th legs into the next chain. Repeat from * across the row. After pulling through all 6 loops at the end of the row, chain 3, work 1 DC into the eye, chain 3, and turn.

Row 2: Yarn over and insert your hook into the first chain, yarn over and pull through 2 loops, yarn over and insert your hook into the eye that is directly below the DC and Ch 3, work 2nd and 3rd legs, yarn over and insert your hook into the next eye, work 4th and 5th legs, yarn over and pull through all 6 loops.

*Chain 3, yarn over and work 1st leg in first chain or eye, work 2nd and 3rd leg into next eye, work 4th and 5th into next eye, yarn over and pull through all 6 loops. Repeat from * across the row. Turn as instructed in row 1. (chain 3, DC, chain 3)

Repeat Row 2 instructions until blanket is 34 inches high.

BORDER

Round 1: After pulling through the 6 loops for the final time, chain 1 and rotate the blanket to work down the first side. Work SC evenly around the entire blanket working 3 SC into each corner. Generally, work 2 SC per each DC post and each ch 3 turning chain on the sides. Do not join the round,

Round 2: Continue working SC into the back loop of each SC, working 3 SC into each corner. Do not join, continue in the same direction.

Round 3: Work the same as round 2.

Round 4: Continuing in the same direction, work 3 DC into each corner and 2 DC into each SC.

Round 5: Continuing in the same direction, work "SC, CH 2" into each DC around. Join with a slip stitch into the starting SC, tie off and weave in the ends.
